Faith can move mountains, no matter how young you are

A 'back to school' meditation by Kat Wagner

After a long summer break, going back to school can feel overwhelming. For children, parents and teachers alike, the new school year means new challenges, routines, friendships and opportunities to grow.

However you may feel when facing a new school term (or a new season in life), God is with us to share our joys and sorrows. We do not have to feel afraid. In fact, we can play an active role in making our everyday places – our classroom, the playground, our home environments, our place of work – a place where others can find friendship and peace. Even if you're very young.

The Bible has lots of examples of young children and young adults following God and influencing their surroundings for the better. It wasn't just the older ones who were wise or influential.

One of the most important kings of Judah, King Josiah, was only eight years old when he became king. He followed a whole series of bad kings who had not honoured God. But Josiah was a good king, and he managed to bring the people of Judah back to their faith in the one true God. "(Josiah) did what was right in the eyes of the Lord and walked in all the ways of David his father, and he did not turn aside to the right or to the left." (2 Kings 22:2). Josiah's 'childlike' faith was so powerful, he encouraged a nation to believe again.

Paul's travelling companion and fellow missionary, Timothy, was much younger than Paul. As a young man, Timothy could have been treated like a nobody, without significance or influence. But Paul saw Timothy's character and the amazing work that Timothy was doing. In a letter, Paul says to Timothy: "Let no one despise you for your youth, but set the believers an example in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith, in purity." (I Timothy 4:12)


And how about the little Israelite girl who was taken as a captive to Syria to serve as a maid in Naaman's house? She had grown up with the stories of God, and she kept her faith alive even in a foreign land away from her family. Naaman had leprosy. The little girl knew that Naaman could be healed by God, and she courageously shared this with her mistress: "If only my master would see the prophet who is in Samaria! He would cure him of his leprosy." (2 Kings 5:3) Naaman believed her, so he found the prophet Elisha and he was healed of his leprosy. Naaman proclaimed: "Now I know that there is no God in all the world except in Israel."

However young we are, our faith can move mountains! Each of our Bible characters here didn't keep their faith in God to themselves; they acted on it. What they said, what they did, and how they lived made a big difference to those around them. Their faith brought life to others.

Have courage that your faith has just as much power! Just think how your prayers, your words and your way of life can influence your friends, colleagues, family and neighbours. Let's start a new school year with God in our hearts and by our side. Amen

How would you describe God to a non-believer?

For me, God is the creator of all things that are. And not only the initiator, but also the guide and the finisher, who will lead all creation and all creatures to consummation.

What's the best thing about your job?

The variety of tasks, the opportunity to meet many different people, the possibility to show others a path to experiencing God's love in their lives.

What's your impression of the Peace Church congregation?

It's a wonderful place to meet wonderful people of all ages. I love it!

How old are you?

I'm 48 years old.

What will your life be like in 10 years?

I actually really don't know. My life has taken so many unexpected turns over the last 10 years. So how could I possibly know? If I had a wish, I would love to be working as a pastor in remote area ministries in Australia – or still be pastor at Peace Church :)

When you were younger, did you play in a school band or in services?

Yes, both: In our school band but also in church and as guitar player for "Chorios" and the former band "Fisherman's Friends". I still play the guitar in a band called "Triple M". I also love to play percussion (based on Cajon) whenever I get an opportunity to do it.

Can you draw/paint?

Not really.

Did you do an internship (for school)?

Actually, not in school. But I did many different short term or part time jobs: at a publishing house, in a bakery, at a grocery, at a nursery, as driver for a car rental company, as transport workers in a car radiator factory, as computer technician, and network administrator.

What do you think about the structure of our service (e.g. the length)?

For me, if I can enjoy a worship service, I don't care so much about the length. I much more care about the quality of every element of the worship service. Because, if you enjoy something, whatever it is, you usually get the feeling that time flies...

Do you plan to do activities with children?

Surely YES! I have grown up in children and youth work in church. I used to be the leader of kid's club for more than 10 years. And I have always loved it. What would be your ideas? What would you like to see that we do for you at Peace Church?

What do you think about the African Choir?

I love it. The singing, the rhythm... I absolutely enjoy it.

Will there be Kids Club?

I would really like to set up a team to restart Kids Club after the summer holidays.

How will we celebrate holidays (Easter, Christmas)?

Just like the congregation is used to it. I understand my starting time here as learning about the traditions at Peace Church. And I will try to add my ideas to that.

How will confirmation take place in future?

I'm sure that I, together with all other people in charge, will make it an absolutely memorable day – which really is fun and a great day for the confirmands and the congregation. And I'm looking forward to hearing about the ideas from the confirmands.

What do you think about African food?

From what I have tasted so far, I really enjoy it.
