Three days before the wedding, I flew from Lagos to Puerto Vallarta, Mexico, with decorations for the colourful Nigerian ceremony. But then we had a shock. Chinwe was hospitalized, getting tested for kidney stones. If the tests were positive, she would need urgent surgery. Thanks be to God, the tests were negative.

We can never anticipate what might happen to our plans. I wonder if Mary expected her long, dusty journey to Bethlehem or the rejection of the innkeeper.
